## **Overview.**

This report has been compiled in January 2026 using Autumn term 2025 data.

There are twenty-eight students who attend TMBSS who are on the SEND register who have Education Health Care Plans (EHCP's) (or have their EHCP's in draft waiting for a provision to be identified), ten students in primary and eighteen students in secondary. The data for these students is compiled on this report.

I have included students whose EHCP's in draft in this report as SEND students.

There are an additional two students who are supported by our Outreach team who have EHCP's and a further three students in the EHCNA process. These students do not follow the same programme as students attending centres and therefore data is not collected in the same way, these students do not appear in the data represented below.

In addition to the students above a further twelve primary aged students are in the EHCNA process and three are in receipt of GSP. In total, in primary every student with the exception of one is somewhere in the EHCNA process or is in receipt of GSP, this equates to 96%.

In secondary a further twenty students are in the EHCNA process and three Outreach students are in the EHCNA process. This equates to 20% of secondary aged students having an EHCP and a total of 43% of secondary aged students somewhere in the EHCNA process (this includes those with EHCP's).

During Autumn term one student with an EHCPs in secondary moved to new educational setting, this was a specialist provision.

Two students with EHCPs in primary have returned to their mainstream provision.

## **Progress.**

This report was compiled in January 2026 to ensure that as many students as possible had two sets of comparable data.

This report uses the data from twenty-eight students: ten primary aged students and eighteen secondary aged students attending TMBSS who had an Education Health Care Plan. There are five students in Primary with an EHCP were also in receipt of pupil premium and ten students in Secondary. Both students with EHCP's receiving outreach support are also in receipt of pupil premium.

Due to the nature of the service TMBSS offers its population is ever changing therefore so is the population of students with an EHCP. The SEND database is regularly updated with new students. Students who have left the Service are left on the database until the end of the academic year but are highlighted in pale blue and will not appear in this progress report.

When writing the report the data required to measure progress is not always available. There are several reasons that this may be the case:

- students may not have attended long enough to have completed two assessments therefore no comparison can be made;
- students may be on a shared placement and may not attend TMBSS for all subjects;
- students may refuse to complete baseline assessments;
- students may have a medical condition that seriously hinders their attendance and therefore their progress.

## **Primary.**

Primary aged students attend Harlescott Education Centre.

This report is using data from the Autumn term 2025 at this time there were ten students with EHCPs, five of these students were eligible for pupil premium.

## **Secondary.**

TMBSS has five secondary centres: Bridgnorth, Shrewsbury, Ludlow, Sundorne and Oswestry.

This report was compiled in January 2026 to include the Autumn 2025 term data.

In Autumn 2025, there were eighteen secondary aged students on TMBSS SEND register with either EHCP's or EHCP's in draft attending the secondary centres. Of the 18 secondary aged students with SEND ten were also eligible for pupil premium. A further two secondary aged students receiving outreach had EHCPs, both were also eligible for pupil premium.

The data below shows the progress for the students who are attending any of the secondary centres and have at least two sets of comparable data.

The two students who receive Outreach support are not included in the data because the work undertaken with them is not always of an academic nature, it is usually work including social, emotional and mental health development.

### **Reading data for KS3 students.**

There were four students in Key Stage 3 attending centres with SEND, all of whom were also eligible for pupil premium.

## Analysis:

To conclude:

- The majority of students who have SEND and attend TMBSS have SEMH as their main area of need or it is in combination with another area of need.
- In primary, during Autumn term, every student with the exception of one is somewhere in the EHCNA process or is in receipt of GSP, this equates to 96%.
- 43% of secondary aged students are somewhere in the EHCNA process
- 56% of students with SEND are also eligible for pupil premium.
- Only one student moved on from TMBSS in the autumn term with an EHCP in secondary and they moved onto specialist provision.
- Two students with an EHCP in Primary returned to mainstream.
- There has been an increase in students unable to access the baseline tests in primary: 40% of students with EHCPs could not access the reading baseline and 30% the spelling baseline.
- 100% of students with EHCP's and at least two sets of comparable data in primary made progress in reading with 75% making accelerated progress.
- 100% of students with EHCP's and at least two sets of comparable data in primary made progress in spelling with 60% making accelerated progress.
- 86% of students with EHCP's and at least two sets of comparable data in primary made progress in Maths, 71% making accelerated progress.
- There is no difference between students progress with SEND compared to those with SEND who are also eligible for pupil premium in primary.
- The vast majority of students in secondary during the autumn term had only completed a baseline assessment for reading, of those who had two lots of comparable data 75% made progress, 50% making accelerated progress in reading.
- 75% of students in Key Stage 3 made progress in English and Maths, there was no difference between students with SEND compared to those with SEND who are also eligible for pupil premium.
- 92% of Key Stage 4 students with SEND made progress in English.
- 93% of Key Stage 4 students with SEND made progress in Maths.
- There was no difference between students with SEND compared to those with SEND who are also eligible for pupil premium in Key Stage 4.
