RE, RSE & PSHE	The 2021 Shropshire Agreed Syllabus provides a syllabus for Religious Education (RE) for Shropshire schools. There is a clear teaching and learning approach at the heart of the 2021 syllabus, whereby all units enable pupils to ‘make sense’ of the religions and beliefs studied, ‘understand the impact’ of these beliefs in people’s lives, and to ‘make connections’ in their learning and their wider experience of the world. This ‘making connections’ element ensures that RE is taught with reference to the pupils and their worldviews in an age-appropriate, critical way. Due to time restraints related to the amount of time pupils spend at Harlescott Education Centre Religious Education and PSHE are not taught as a stand-alone subject and are instead incorporated into a weekly assembly session. The content of this session is timetabled to provide a breadth of study including Christianity and other world religions ensuring we are preparing our students for life in modern Britain. In addition, we link these sessions to British Values as required in the DFE legislation in 2014 stating that school must teach the British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. Where appropriate there may also be a Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning (PSHE) focus.
