

SEND Report

September 2023



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Overview

This report has been compiled in September 2023.

Over the academic year 2022/23 TMBSS has educated 51 students who had Education Health Care Plans (EHCP's): 16 students in primary and 35 students in secondary, 3 of these were accessing outreach provision. These students were on roll at TMBSS for differing periods of time and many EHCP's that we had applied for remained in draft for months until suitable provision was found for the students. There were 2 students who had their EHCP's in draft for 11 months.

In primary 1 application for an EHCP was made solely by TMBSS and TMBSS supported the applications made by mainstream for a further 4 students, all of which were successful.

In secondary, 20 applications were made for EHCP assessments, 9 of which were successful, (some of these did get to the mediation stage before an assessment was granted), 9 of which we are awaiting either a decision, a draft or final plan. We have supported 11 parental requests, 10 were successful and one was not and mediation has been asked for.

In primary, over the year 13 students with EHCP's moved to specialist placements and 3 returned to mainstream.

In secondary, over the year we had 12 students with EHCPs move to specialist provision, 1 school leaver will have a very bespoke programme run by REACH for Inclusion and 1 year 11 left just prior to the exams and was admitted to a tier 4 bed out of county.

This report was compiled in September 2023 to include the GCSE results from June 2023 and uses data from summer term 2023 for all year groups.

During summer term TMBSS were involved with 26 students with Education Health and Care Plans: 7 primary aged students and 16 students attending secondary centres, a further 3 students attending TMBSS outreach provision and 1 who left at the end of May because she was admitted to a Tier 4 bed.

There were 2 students in primary with EHCP's who were also in receipt of pupil premium and 10 students in secondary, 2 of the outreach students and the girl who was admitted to a Tier 4 bed were also in receipt of pupil premium.

Due to the nature of the service TMBSS offers its population is ever changing, therefore, so is the population of students with EHCP's. The SEND database is regularly updated with new students and students who have left the Service are left on until the end of the term but are highlighted in pale blue and will not appear in this progress report.

When writing the report the data required to measure progress is not always available.

There are several reasons that this may be the case:

- the data is a snapshot in time and only students with EHCP's and comparable data on the day of the data collection will be processed as SEN;
- students may not have attended long enough to have completed two assessments therefore no comparison can be made;
- students may only be able to manage to study one subject due to SEMH;
- students may be on a shared placement and may not attend TMBSS for all subjects;
- students may refuse to complete baseline assessment;
- students may have a medical condition that seriously hinders their attendance and therefore their progress.

Primary

Harlescott is the main primary centre and in the summer term there was also a smaller hub at Monkmoor Centre for years 1, 2 and 3. Moving into September 2023 all primary students will be attending Harlescott centre.

This report is using data from Summer term 2023, at this time there were 7 students attending the Primary centres with EHCPs, 2 of these students were also eligible for pupil premium.

A further 9 students had draft EHCPs; a further 9 students were under assessment and there was 1 student in receipt of GSP.

Reading data progress from baseline to Summer term review:

There is comparable data available for 4 students the other 3 students were new and had completed baseline assessments only.

Secondary

TMBSS has five secondary centres: Bridgnorth, Shrewsbury, Ludlow, Sundorne and Oswestry.

This report was compiled in September 2023 so that the GCSE results could be included as well as the progress data from summer 2023.

In summer 2023 there were 21 students attending the secondary centres with EHCPs. There were a further 3 secondary aged students receiving outreach support. Of the 21 Secondary aged students with SEND 10 were also eligible for pupil premium.

There were 9 students in Year 11 with Education Health and Care Plans, which equates to just less than 16% of the total Year 11 cohort of which there was 58 students.

Of the 9 students in Year 11 with SEND 2 were also eligible for pupil premium.

Reading data for KS3 students

Reading data is only collected for students attending centres, outreach students have very different needs and receive limited sessions, therefore testing and re-testing is not appropriate for the majority of them.

There were 5 students in Key Stage 3 with SEND, 3 of which were also eligible for pupil premium.

3 students had comparable data.

Student H achieved Entry Levels in English and Maths.

SEND students sat a total of 38 GCSE's.

All achieved a qualification in English and Maths; 94% of these were GCSE's.

Analysis:

To conclude:

- Over the academic year 2022/23 TMBSS has educated 51 students who had Education Health Care Plans (EHCP's): 16 students in primary and 35 students in secondary, 3 of these were accessing Outreach provision
- During summer term TMBSS were involved with 26 students with Education Health and Care Plans: 7 primary aged students and 16 students attending secondary centres, a further 3 students attending TMBSS outreach provision and 1 who left at the end of May because she was admitted to a Tier 4 bed.
- Students in both primary and secondary have been slow to move onto their next placements and many EHCP's have remained in draft for months. Two students had their EHCP's in draft for 11 months.
- In primary over the year 2022/23, 13 students with EHCP's moved to specialist placements and 3 returned to mainstream.
- All secondary aged students with EHCP's who left TMBSS in 2022/23 went onto to a specialist placement with the exception of 1 who unfortunately had to be accommodated in a Tier 4 bed.
- All EHCP requests for assessment from TMBSS were successful in the year 2022/23-with a few having to go through the mediation process before assessment was approved.
- The majority of students who have SEND and attend TMBSS have SEMH as their main area of need or it is in combination with another area of need.
- Primary aged students with SEND and who are eligible for pupil premium are not disadvantaged.
- 75% of primary students with comparable data made progress or accelerated progress in reading and spelling.
- 100% of primary students with data made accelerated progress in Maths.
- All Key Stage 3 students with comparable data made expected or accelerated progress in reading: 67% made accelerated progress, 33% made expected progress.
- 100% of key Stage 3 students with SEN in receipt of pupil premium made accelerated progress.
- Reading progress in Key Stage 4 is positive with 50% making accelerated progress; 14% making progress and 14% achieving a reading age of 16+ years on their first test.
- In Key Stage 3, 80% of students made expected or accelerated progress in English and 100% of students made expected or accelerated progress in Maths .
- In Year 10, 100% of students with data made expected progress in English and Maths
- Students with a SEND and in receipt of pupil premium are not at a disadvantage in any area.
- There were 9 students in Year 11 taking external examinations.
- SEND students sat a total of 38 GCSE's, exactly double the number from last year (last year there were 2 less students)
- All achieved a qualification in English and Maths; 94% of these were GCSE's.
