Overview.

This report has been compiled in January 2025 using Autumn term 2024 data.

There are 32 students who attend TMBSS who are on the SEND register who have Education Health Care Plans (EHCP's) (or have their EHCP's in draft waiting for a provision to be identified), 12 students in primary and 20 students in secondary. The data for these students is compiled on this report.

I have included students whose EHCP's in draft in this report as SEND students.

There are an additional 5 students who are supported by our Outreach team, they do not follow the same programme as students attending centres and therefore data is not collected in the same way, these students do not appear in the data represented below.

In addition to the students above, TMBSS are awaiting: 6 EHCP drafts/final EHCP's for secondary aged students. A further 5 primary aged students were under- going assessments for an EHCP.

During Autumn term 15 students with EHCP's in secondary have moved to new educational settings: 9 has moved to a specialist provision, 2 are on an EOTAS packages, 1 returned to mainstream and 1 has moved to a grammar school. A further 3 secondary aged students who were receiving outreach support have moved to new educational settings: 2 to specialist and 1 is going to receive outreach from their mainstream.

4 students with EHCP's in primary moved to a specialist provision and 1 student with an EHCP in primary returned to mainstream.

Progress.

This report was compiled in January 2025 to ensure that as many students has possible had two sets of comparable data.

This report uses the data from 32 students: 12 primary aged students and 20 secondary aged students attending TMBSS who had an Education Health Care Plans. There are 7 students in Primary with an EHCP were also in receipt of pupil premium and 12 students in Secondary. 1 out of the 5 students receiving outreach support are also in receipt of pupil premium.

Due to the nature of the service TMBSS offers its population is ever changing therefore so is the population of students with an EHCP. The SEND database is regularly updated with new students. Students who have left the Service are left on the database until the end of the academic year but are highlighted in pale blue and will not appear in this progress report.

When writing the report the data required to measure progress is not always available. There are several reasons that this may be the case:

- students may not have attended long enough to have completed two assessments therefore no comparison can be made;
- students may be on a shared placement and may not attend TMBSS for all subjects;

- students may refuse to complete baseline assessment;
- students may have a medical condition that seriously hinders their attendance and therefore their progress.

Primary.

Primary aged students attend Harlescott centre.

This report is using data from the Autumn term 2024, at this time there were 12 students with EHCPs, 7 of these students were eligible for pupil premium.

Secondary.

TMBSS has five secondary centres: Bridgnorth, Shrewsbury, Ludlow, Sundorne and Oswestry.

This report was compiled in January 2025 to include the Autumn 2024 term data.

In Autumn 2024, there were 20 secondary aged students on TMBSS SEND register with either EHCP's or EHCP's in draft attending the secondary centres. Of the 20 secondary aged students with SEND 12 were also eligible for pupil premium. A further 5 secondary aged students receiving outreach had EHCPs, 1 of those was also eligible for pupil premium.

The data below shows the progress for the students who are attending any of the secondary centres and have at least two sets of comparable data.

The 5 students who receive Outreach support are not included in the data because the work undertaken with them is not always of an academic nature, it is usually work including social, emotional and mental health development.

Reading data for KS3 students.

There were 5 students in Key Stage 3 attending centres with SEND, 3 of whom were also eligible for pupil premium.

Analysis:

To conclude:

- The majority of students who have SEND and attend TMBSS have SEMH as their main area of need or it is in combination with another area of need.
- 59% of students with SEND are also eligible for pupil premium.
- The majority of students who moved on from TMBSS in the autumn term with an EHCP moved onto specialist provision: 80% of students moving on from primary moved to a specialist provision and 67% of students moving on from secondary either moved on to specialist or were given an EOTAS package from the local authority.
- 83% of students with EHCP's and at least two sets of comparable date in primary made progress in reading with 67% making accelerated progress.
- 83% of students with EHCP's and at least two sets of comparable data in primary made progress in spelling with 50% making accelerated progress.
- 100% of students with EHCP's and at least two sets of comparable data in primary made progress in Maths, 71% making accelerated progress.
- More students attending primary have learning needs that mean that they are unable to access the baseline tests.
- There is no difference between students progress with SEND compared to those with SEND who are also eligible for pupil premium in primary.
- The vast majority of students in secondary during the autumn term had only completed a baseline assessment for reading, of those who had two lots of comparable data 100% made accelerated progress in reading.
- 80% of students in Key Stage 3 made progress in English and Maths, there was no difference between students with SEND compared to those with SEND who are also eligible for pupil premium.
- 93% of Key Stage 4 students with SEND made progress in English.
- 100% of Key Stage 4 students with SEND made progress in Maths.
- There was no difference between students with SEND compared to those with SEND who are also eligible for pupil premium in Key Stage 4.
